The Cicero Firefighters are requesting a permit to install two "Little Free Libraries" outside the fire stations at 5303 W. 25th Street (Eng. 2) and 5410 W. 34th Street (Eng. 3). We plan to purchase, install, and stock the "little libraries" with children's books that will be free for anyone to take. The dimensions of the proposed "little libraries" are approximately 15" deep x 18" wide x 21" high, and mounted on a post approximately 36" off of the ground. It will look like a small house with a glass front door so members of the community passing by can see the books available inside. Attached to this letter are photos, descriptions, and dimensions of the library house and post. At Engine 2 we plan to install the "little library" outside, near the corner of the firehouse, a few feet from the front door of the fire station. 




Composite Two Story Red Little Free Library

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10, SECTION 10-32 AND CHAPTER 62, SECTION 62-36 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF CICERO, ILLINOIS REGARDING PRIVATE SECURITY CONTRACTORS FOR THE TOWN OF CICERO, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cicero (the "Town") was created by a charter enacted by the Illinois General Assembly (the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Town (as defined below) are governed by the Charter and the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the statutes of the State of Illinois when not specified in the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and as a home rule unit of local government the Town may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Town President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Town (the "Town Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the safety of individuals visiting, residing in, and working in the Town; and

WHEREAS, currently, The Code of Ordinances of the Town of Cicero, Illinois (the "Town Code") regulates the employment of private security contractors and agencies within the Town (the "Existing Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities recognize that it is necessary to update the Existing Regulations from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Town wishes to ensure that any persons or firms providing private security services are duly licensed by the State of Illinois and that any person carrying a weapon is qualified, under law, to carry said weapon; and

WHEREAS, in order to encourage compliance with the State of Illinois' licensing requirements and to attempt to ensure that only persons or firms that are licensed to provide security and to carry a weapon, if applicable, are operating within the Town, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Town and its residents to require that all private security firms must register with the Town and show proof of State licensure before the firm may perform any security duties;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Section 1.00 Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

Section 2.00 Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 10, Section 10-32 and Chapter 62, Section 62-36 of the Town Code to update the Existing Regulations regarding employment of private security contractors.

ARTICLE II. AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 10, SECTION 10-32 AND CHAPTER 62, SECTION 62-36 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF CICERO, ILLINOIS

Section 3.00 Amendment to Chapter 10, Section 10-32.

That the Town Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Town Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 10, Section 10-32, which Section shall be amended as follows:

Sec. 10-32. - Use of private security in licensed establishments; employees providing security.

- (a) A licensed premises may only employ private security contractors or agencies as provided for by section 62-36. A liquor licensee shall be required to maintain copies of any private security licenses for persons or firms providing private security at his or her establishment. A liquor licensee shall disclose the name of any firm or person providing private security to the Liquor Commissioner or his designee quarterly and provide copies of current licenses for such persons or firms. Such Any failure of a licensed premises or its owners and/or operators to comply with the provisions of section 62-36 shall be deemed a violation of this chapter as well as chapter 62 and may subject the noncompliant party to a minimum fine of \$250.00 up to a maximum fine of \$750.00, as well as possible suspension and/or revocation of the noncompliant party's local liquor license.
- (b) In the event that a liquor licensee directly employs any person to provide security services for the licensee's establishment, whether on a full-time or part-time basis, the licensee shall disclose such information, including proof of employment, quarterly to the Liquor Commissioner or his designee.
- (c) Any violation of this section may subject the noncompliant party to a minimum fine of \$250.00 up to a maximum fine of \$750.00, as well as possible suspension and/or revocation of the noncompliant party's local liquor license.

Section 3.01 Amendment to Chapter 62, Section 62-36.

That the Town Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Town Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 62, Section 62-36, which Section shall be amended as follows:

Sec. 62-36. – Employment of private security contractor or agency.

(a) Definitions.

- (1) As used in this section, *private security contractor* means any person who engages in the business of providing a private guard, watchman, patrol service, or any like service by another title or name on a contractual basis for another person, firm, association or corporation for a fee or other valuable consideration and performing one or more of the following security acts:
 - a. The prevention or detection of intrusion, entry, theft, vandalism, abuse, fire or trespass on private or governmental property.
 - b. The prevention, observation or detection of any authorized activity on private or governmental property.
 - c. The protection of patrons and persons lawfully authorized to be on the premises of the person, firm, association or corporation for whom he contractually is obligated to provide security services.
 - d. The prevention of the misappropriation or concealment of goods, money, bonds, stocks, notes, valuable documents or papers.
 - e. The control, regulation or direction of the flow or movement of the public, whether by vehicle or otherwise, only to the extent and for the time directly and specifically required to assure the protection of property on property owned or controlled by the client.
 - f. The protection of individuals from bodily harm or death (bodyguard functions).
- (2) Private security contractor agency means any person, firm, association, or corporation that engages in the private security contractor business and that employs one or more persons in conducting business

similar to the "security acts" outlined in the definition of private security contractor, see above.

- (3) Weapons shall include, but not be limited to, a firearm, loaded or unloaded; a bludgeon, black-jack, slung-shot, sand-club, sand-bag, metal knuckles or other knuckle weapon regardless of its composition; throwing star, or any knife, commonly referred to as a switchblade knife or a ballistic knife; a stun gun or taser; mace or pepper spray or any other dangerous or deadly weapon or instrument of like character.
- (b) Employment of private security contractor or private security contractor agency. No person, business, firm, association or corporation shall employ a person, firm, association or corporation as a private security contractor or private security contractor agency unless such private security contractor or private security contractor agency (collectively, "security firms or persons") is licensed pursuant to the private detective, private alarm, private security, and locksmith act of 2004, 225 ILCS 447/1, et seq., or is exempt from such licensing requirements pursuant to section 25-5 of such act. Any business employing security firms or persons that are required to be licensed by the state shall be required to retain a copy of said license on or at the premises where the security is being provided. A business owner or operator's failure to ensure that the security firms or persons are duly licensed by the state and/or a failure to keep a copy of the license on or at the premises shall be a violation of this section of the town Code and may subject the business owner to a penalty as detailed herein.
- (c) *Private security carrying a weapon*. No private security contractor, as defined in this section of the town Code, shall be permitted to carry a weapon while serving as a private security contractor (as enumerated in Section 720 ILCS 5/24-1) unless the private security contract verifies the specific contractor is also a licensed and sworn "peace officer," as defined in Section 725 ILCS 5/107-4(a)(2)) or has met the requirements set forth in Section 725 ILCS 5/24-2(a)(5) or is otherwise permitted under law to carry such item.
- (d) *Registration required*. Any and all security firms or persons providing private security in the town shall be required to register with the town. An administrative fee of \$50.00 \$250.00 shall be charged to the security firms or persons. The registration shall include disclosing or providing copies of the following information:
 - (1) The name and address of the owner of the security firms or persons; and
 - (2) The name and address of the security firms or persons' registered agent, if any; and
 - (3) A 24-hour, seven days a week contact number and person; and

- (4) The names and addresses of any and all businesses and/or locations where the security firms or persons are providing security services; and
- (5) The name and phone number for the supervisor(s) on duty, if any, for the security firms or persons; and
- (6) A copy of the security firms or <u>and its security employees' persons'</u> State of Illinois issued license; and
- (7) A statement regarding whether the persons providing security will be carrying weapons, including firearms, Billy clubs, mace, pepper spray, tasers, or any other items, and a copy of the license for any individual carrying a weapon. The specific weapons being carried must be disclosed.
- (e) *Penalty*. A minimum fine of \$250.00 and a maximum fine of \$750.00 shall be imposed for violations of this section. Additionally, a business violating this section may face suspensions and/or revocations of any and all licenses issued to a business by the Town of Cicero.

Section 3.02 Other Actions Authorized.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 94, SECTION 94-171 AND SECTION 94-179 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF CICERO, ILLINOIS REGARDING PARKING IN THE TOWN OF CICERO, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cicero (the "Town") was created by a charter enacted by the Illinois General Assembly (the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Town (as defined below) are governed by the Charter and the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the statutes of the State of Illinois when not specified in the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and as a home rule unit of local government the Town may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Town President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Town (the "Town Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring that local traffic congestion and lack of available parking do not pose a danger to pedestrians and motorists; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 11-80-2 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-80-2), the corporate authorities of each municipality may regulate the use of the streets and other municipal property; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of the Town and its residents to address traffic congestion and lack of available parking near the Laramie Avenue bridge, by designating this area as parking for Town residents only; and

WHEREAS, it is understood that additional steps need to be taken to ensure that parking signs are properly installed and maintained; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing findings, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Town and its residents to amend Chapter 94, Section 94-171 and Chapter 94, Section 94-179 of The Code of Ordinances of the Town of Cicero, Illinois (the "Town Code") to designate the area near the Laramie Avenue bridge as residential parking only; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Section 1.00 Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

Section 2.00 Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 94, Section 94-171 and Chapter 94, Section 94-179 to designate the area near the Laramie Avenue bridge as residential parking only and to ensure the proper installation and maintenance of the corresponding street signs.

ARTICLE II.

AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 94, SECTION 94-171 AND CHAPTER 94, SECTION 94-179 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF CICERO, ILLINOIS

Section 3.00 Amendment to Chapter 94, Section 94-171.

That the Town Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution, or Town Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 94, Section 94-171 which Section shall be amended as follows:

Sec. 94-171. - Parking prohibited at all times on certain streets; schedule I.

In accordance with section 94-262 and when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall at any time park a vehicle upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets:

. . .

Laramie Avenue Bridge, also known as 52nd Avenue Bridge.

. . .

Section 3.01 Amendment to Chapter 94, Section 94-179.

That the Town Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Town Code section to the contrary, by amending Chapter 94, Section 94-179 which Section shall be amended as follows:

Sec. 94-179. - Residential parking; schedule IX.

In accordance with section 94-271, the following areas are designated as "residential parking only" areas, and when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall park any vehicle at any time between the hours set forth in this section except a person who is an actual resident of the town and who has a current town vehicle tag properly affixed to the vehicle being parked; the term "vehicle tag" shall be defined as the vehicle license required in article II of chapter 106:

Laramie Avenue Bridge Also Known as Laramie Court, in accordance with posted signs.

Section 3.02 Other Actions Authorized.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Town shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to, and consummate the amendments contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith, including taking all necessary steps to ensure the proper installation and continuing maintenance of appropriate street signs located along the Laramie Avenue bridge area. The officers, employees, and/or agents of the Town are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms to be utilized in connection with these amendments.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 4.00 Headings.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF VEHICLES FOR THE TOWN OF CICERO, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cicero (the "Town") was created by a charter enacted by the Illinois General Assembly (the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Town (as defined below) are governed by the Charter and the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the statutes of the State of Illinois when not specified in the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and as a home rule unit of local government the Town may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Cicero Police Department (the "Police Department") protects the public by responding to criminal activity and other emergencies; and

WHEREAS, the Fleet Maintenance Department ("Fleet Maintenance" and together with the Police Department, the "Departments") manages the vehicles and related equipment owned and operated by the Town for the benefit of its departments and employees; and

WHEREAS, to ensure the continued efficient operation of the Departments, it has been determined that the Town in need of four (4) additional vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the Departments have requested that the Town purchase four (4) Chevrolet Tahoe's (the "Vehicles"); and

WHEREAS, Currie Motors (the "Vendor") has provided the Town with invoices for the purchase of the Vehicles (the "Invoices"); and

WHEREAS, copies of the Invoices are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2, Section 2-868, of The Code of Ordinances of the Town of Cicero, Illinois provides that competitive bidding is not required for purchases or contracts wherein advertising for bids has been waived by a majority of a quorum of the Town Board; and

WHEREAS, the Town President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Town (the "Town Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") deem it advisable and necessary for the operation of the Departments and the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Town to purchase the Vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable, and in the best interests of the Town and its residents to take all steps necessary to purchase the Vehicles in accordance with the terms of the Invoices;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Section 1.00 Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

Section 2.00 Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize the purchase of the Vehicles in accordance with the terms of the Invoices, and to authorize the President or his designee to take all necessary steps to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II. AUTHORIZATION

Section 3.00 Authorization.

The Town Board hereby authorizes the purchase of the Vehicles from the Vendor in accordance with the terms of the Invoices and authorizes and directs the President or his designee to execute any and all necessary documentation to effectuate the same, with such insertions, omissions, and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Town Attorney and ratifies any additional actions taken to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance. The Town Board further authorizes the President or his designee to execute any and all additional documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. The Town Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Town to such documentation as is deemed necessary. To the extent that any requirement of bidding would be applicable to the Vehicles described herein, the same is hereby waived.

Section 7.00 Publication.

A full, true, and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Town as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

Section 8.00 Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE DISPOSAL OF OBSOLETE PERSONAL PROPERTY FOR THE TOWN OF CICERO, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cicero (the "Town") was created by a charter enacted by the Illinois General Assembly (the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Town (as defined below) are governed by the Charter and the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the statutes of the State of Illinois when not specified in the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and as a home rule unit of local government the Town may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 11-76-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-76-4), whenever a municipality owns any personal property, which in the opinion of a simple majority of the corporate authorities then holding office is no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of the municipality, such a majority of the corporate authorities then holding office may: (1) authorize, by ordinance, the sale of that personal property in such manner as they may designate, with or without advertising the sale; (2) authorize any municipal officer to convert that personal property into some other form that is useful to the municipality by using the material in the personal property; or (3) authorize any municipal officer to convey or turn in any specified article of personal property as partial payment on a new purchase of any similar article; and

WHEREAS, the Town, as a home rule municipality, also has the authority to

dispose of or discard obsolete personal property; and

WHEREAS, the Town's Fire Department (the "Department") has requested that the Town dispose of or discard certain obsolete information technology equipment that no longer has value to the Town (the "Personal Property"), which is described in certain documents (the "Documents"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Group Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Department intends to dispose of the Personal Property in a fair, secure, and reasonable manner; and

WHEREAS, the Town President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Town (the "Town Board", and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") have reviewed the Documents and have determined that retaining the Personal Property, which is obsolete, is no longer usable or repairable, or is surplus property or rubbish, is no longer necessary or useful to or for the best interests of the Town; and

WHEREAS, to ensure that the Town operates in an efficient and economical manner, it is necessary for the Town and Town employees to have adequate space for functional equipment and personal property; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities find that it is necessary for conducting Town business, the effective administration of government, and in the best interests of the Town and its residents to authorize the Fire Chief or his designee, to sell, dispose of, or discard the Personal Property;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Section 1.00 Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

Section 2.00 Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize the Fire Chief or his designee to dispose of or discard the Personal Property to help ensure that the Town and Town employees have adequate space for functional equipment and personal property, and to take all necessary steps to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II. AUTHORIZATION

Section 3.00 Authorization.

The Town Board hereby authorizes and directs the Fire Chief or his designee to dispose of or discard the Personal Property in accordance with the terms of this Ordinance and ratifies any and all previous action taken to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance. The Town Board authorizes and directs the President and the Fire Chief or designees of the same, to execute any and all documentation that may be necessary to carry out the intent of this Ordinance. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance. The Town Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Town to such documentation as is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE III. HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 4.00 Headings.

The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs, and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

Section 5.00 Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute, or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable, and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid, and in full force and effect.

Section 6.00 Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules, and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 7.00 Publication.

A full, true, and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Town as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

Section 8.00 Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval.

THE NAME OF PARTICIPATING AGENCY AND THE ILLINOIS STATE POLICE

Pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1, et seq., this Intergovernmental Operating Agreement ("Agreement") is entered by and between Cicero Police Department, a municipal law enforcement agency within the Town of Cicero, Illinois, ("Participating Agency"), and the Illinois State Police ("ISP"), an Illinois law enforcement agency. This Agreement creates the Violent Crime Intelligence Task Force pursuant to 20 ILCS 2605/2605-605 and sets forth conditions for participation.

WHEREAS, the Participating Agency is a law enforcement agency dedicated to combating crime in its jurisdiction, including but not limited to gun violence, gun-trafficking, and other violent crime;

WHEREAS, the ISP is authorized to establish a statewide multi-jurisdictional Violent Crime Intelligence Task Force pursuant to the Illinois State Police Law (20 ILCS 2605/2605-605);

WHEREAS, both the ISP and the Participating Agency (collectively, "Parties") agree that it is in the best interests of the Parties and the public to share information and develop partnerships where feasible to reduce and prevent illegal possession and use of firearms, solve firearm-related crimes, and otherwise reduce violent crimes in Illinois;

WHEREAS, the mission of this Task Force is to preserve life, eliminate the fear of violent crime, and reduce the occurrence of violent crime; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force is intended to focus on reducing and preventing illegal possession and use of firearms, firearm related homicides, and other violent crimes (20 ILCS 2605/2605-605), in part, by enhancing enforcement of the Firearm Owner Identification (FOID) Card Act, the Firearm Concealed Carry Act, the Firearm Dealer License Certification Act, and Article 24 of the Criminal Code of 2012;

WHEREAS, the Parties agree that in order to further these goals and objectives, the Participating Agency shall, upon execution of this Agreement, become a member of the above referenced Violent Crime Intelligence Task Force; and

WHEREAS, both the ISP and the Participating Agency agree the Parties shall perform their duties with the utmost integrity in their respective operations;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

I. TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2023, and shall continue year to year until amended or modified by mutual agreement of the Parties or until terminated as provided herein. In any event, the Parties agree that the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be reviewed periodically and updated as necessary. This Agreement supersedes all prior Agreements between the Participating Agency and the ISP with respect to the matters addressed herein.

II. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. The Task Force may develop and acquire information, training, tools, and resources necessary to implement a data-driven approach to policing, with an emphasis on intelligence development. 20 ILCS 2605/2605-605(1).
- 2. The Task Force may utilize information sharing, partnerships, crime analysis, and evidence-based practices to assist in the reduction of firearm-related shootings, homicides, and gun-trafficking. 2605-605(2).
- 3. The Task Force may recognize and utilize best practices of community policing and may develop potential partnerships with faith-based and community organizations to achieve its goals. 2605-605(3).
- 4. The Task Force may identify and utilize best practices in drug-diversion programs and other community-based services to redirect low-level offenders. 2605-605(4).
- 5. The Task Force may assist in violence suppression strategies including, but not limited to, details in identified locations that have shown to be the most prone to gun violence and violent crime, focused deterrence against violent gangs and groups considered responsible for the violence in communities, and other intelligence driven methods deemed necessary to interrupt cycles of violence or prevent retaliation. 2605-605(5).
- 6. In consultation with the Chief Procurement Officer, the Department of State Police may obtain contracts for software, commodities, resources, and equipment to assist the Task

Force with achieving this Act. Any contracts necessary to support the delivery of necessary software, commodities, resources, and equipment are not subject to the Illinois Procurement Code, except for Sections 20-60 (duration of contracts), 20-65 (right to audit records), 20-70 (finality of determination), and 20-160 (business entities; certifications; registration with the State Board of elections) and Article 50 (procurement ethics and disclosure) of that Code, provided that the Chief Procurement Officer may, in writing with justification, waive any certification required under Article 50 of the Illinois Procurement Code. 2605-605(6).

- 7. The Task Force will conduct enforcement operations against persons whose Firearm Owner's Identification Cards have been revoked or suspended and persons who fail to comply with the requirements of Section 9.5 of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act, prioritizing individuals presenting a clear and present danger to themselves or to others under paragraph (2) of subsection (d) of Section 8.1 of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act. 2605-605(7).
- 8. The Task Force will collaborate with local law enforcement agencies to enforce provisions of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act, the Firearm Concealed Carry Act, the Firearm Dealer License Certification Act, and Article 24 of the Criminal Code of 2012. 2605-605(8).
- 9. By joining the Task Force, other Law Enforcement Agencies understand each agency, including the ISP, is responsible for their own costs, expenses, equipment, and personnel salaries and benefits. This Agreement does not create any financial obligation between any Law Enforcement Agency including the ISP.
- 10. All members of the Task Force will share information related to violent crimes as necessary and appropriate for joint investigations.
- 11. All members of the Task Force will share data related to violent crimes as necessary and appropriate for resource allocation and reporting requirements.
- 12. All members of the Task Force will share information related to invalid or revoked FOID cards in circulation in their jurisdictions, as well as their efforts to recover such FOID cards.
- 13. All members of the Task Force may share personnel and equipment to assist other member agencies of the Task Force.

III. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

- 1. The Director of the ISP or the designee of same shall:
 - A. Designate an ISP Command Officer to serve as a member of Violent Crime Intelligence Task Force;
 - B. Collaborate with local law enforcement agencies to enforce provisions of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act, the Firearm Concealed Carry Act, the Firearm Dealer License Certification Act, and Article 24 of the Criminal Code of 2012;
 - C. Maintain and be the custodian of all records related to or generated by the Task Force. The records may include reports, notes, communications, databases, photographs, diagrams, maps, electronic and digitized material. All records will be maintained in compliance with relevant Record Retention Schedules and the State Records Act [5 ILCS 160/et seq.];
 - D. In its role as the custodian of all records generated, ISP shall respond to requests for records made under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). [5 ILCS 140/et seq.] If records were created for the Participating Agency, the ISP may require an update on the status of an investigation to determine whether any statutory exemptions apply (e.g., whether a case is an active criminal investigation); and
 - E. Manage the granting of funds from the FOID Enforcement Fund pursuant to the Illinois State Police Law.
- 2. The Chief or Sheriff of the Participating Agency or the designee of the same shall:
 - A. Designate members of the Participating Agency to serve as members of the Violent Crime Intelligence Task Force;
 - B. Conduct enforcement operations against persons whose Firearm Owner's Identification Cards have been revoked or suspended and persons who fail to comply with the requirements of Section 9.5 of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act, prioritizing individuals presenting a clear and present danger to themselves or to others under paragraph (2) of subsection (d) of Section 8.1 of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act;

- C. Collaborate with the ISP to enforce provisions of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act, the Firearm Concealed Carry Act, the Firearm Dealer License Certification Act, and Article 24 of the Criminal Code of 2012;
- D. Respond to case status inquiries in a timely manner so the ISP may satisfy FOIA deadlines;
- E. Serve as the custodian of its records and responding to requests made to it under the Freedom of Information Act. [5 ILCS 140/et seq.]; and
- F. Designate an employee to receive grant funds from the FOID Enforcement Fund awarded pursuant to Illinois State Police Law.

IV. FOID ENFORCEMENT FUND GRANTS

1. The ISP shall:

- A. Determine the Participating Agency's eligibility to receive grant funds from the FOID Enforcement Fund;
- B. Where funds are available and have been appropriated, award grant funds from the FOID Enforcement Fund;
- C. Require monthly performance and quarterly financial reporting from the Participating Agency when grant funds have been awarded; and
- D. Ensure grant funds are spent in such a manner so as to affect the purpose of this Agreement, with specific emphasis on placing individuals into compliance who have had their firearm rights revoked or suspended and have been identified as presenting a risk to public safety in Illinois as determined by the ISP Division of Criminal Investigations (DCI).
- 2. Participating Agencies that apply for and receive FOID Enforcement Grant Funds shall:
 - A. Designate a member of its Participating Agency to receive and manage grant funds from the FOID Enforcement Fund awarded pursuant to this Agreement;
 - B. Execute the Task Force Grant Agreement Addendum, which shall be incorporated to this Agreement by reference;

- C. Comply with required monthly performance and quarterly financial reporting within 7 days after the end of each reporting period when grant funds have been awarded;
- D. Ensure grant funds are spent in such a manner so as to affect the purpose of this Agreement and in compliance with the ISP Firearm Safety Enforcement Grant Detail Protocols as established by the ISP DCI;
- E. Focus its efforts on placing individuals into compliance who have had their firearm rights revoked or suspended and have been identified as presenting a risk to public safety in Illinois as determined by the ISP DCI; and
- F. Retain records sufficient to support the expenditure of grant funds for a period of not less than seven years and cooperate with any request to audit such records from the Illinois State Police or Illinois Auditor general.

V. APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement shall be governed and construed according to Illinois law.

VI. MEMBERSHIP

Membership in the Task Force is created when both authorized signatures of the Law Enforcement Agency and the Illinois State Police appear on the last page of the Agreement. New members of the Task Force need only execute (sign and date) the last page of this Agreement for ISP to consider membership in the Task Force. Once membership in the Task Force is approved by the ISP, the signed signature page will be returned to the Law Enforcement Agency. An emailed, or .pdf copy of the signatures on the signature page is the same as the original signature. This same language appears at the top of the Signature Page.

VII. COUNTERPARTS

This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be considered to be one and the same agreement, binding on all Parties hereto, notwithstanding that all Parties are not signatories to the same counterpart. Duplicated signatures, signatures transmitted via facsimile, or signatures contained in a Portable Document Format ("PDF") document shall be deemed original for all purposes.

VIII. INFORMATION SECURITY PROTOCOLS.

All Parties shall comply with applicable Illinois and Federal court orders and subpoenas, federal statutes and regulations, and Illinois administrative rules regarding dissemination of confidential and/or personal identifying information. All records and information related to the Task Force shall be protected by the parties from unlawful dissemination. Notice to all parties is required in the event of a breach of confidential information, and responsibility for any improper dissemination of confidential records and/or personal identifying information is the sole responsibility of the party that committed the breach.

IX. TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by mutual agreement of the Parties or upon at least 30 days written notice and after returning of any borrowed equipment as well as the expenditure of all grant funds awarded hereunder.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties hereto have executed this Agreement, and this Agreement shall be effective from the day and year first above written. This Agreement contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the Parties. No other understandings, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement shall be deemed to exist or to bind any of the Parties hereto.

WHEREAS, due to unforeseen circumstances, it has been determined that Resolution No. 55-23 should be rescinded; and

WHEREAS, in light of the foregoing, the Town President (the "President") and the Town Board (together, the "Corporate Authorities"), desire to rescind Resolution No. 55-23; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and the duly authorized Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero, County of Cook, State of Illinois as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Section 1.00 Findings.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Resolution as legislative findings.
