





# FINDINGS OF FACT AND RECOMMENDATION OF THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS

**RE:** 3314 South Cicero Avenue (the "Subject Property")

#### **GRANT OF A SIGN VARIANCE**

On May 25, 2022, the Zoning Board of Appeals (the "ZBA") of the Town of Cicero (the "Town") recommended granting a certain sign variance for the Subject Property, based on the following:

- 1. The Subject Property is located in the M-2 zoning district in the Town; and
- 2. Integrity Sign Company through Austin Davis and on behalf of Midwest Express Clinic (collectively, the "Applicants") submitted an application to the ZBA seeking a sign variance to allow the installation of wall signs on the rear of the building, which faces Cicero Avenue (collectively, the "Zoning Relief") in connection with the operation of a Midwest Express Clinic at the Subject Property (the "Existing Use"); and
- 3. The Town's ordinance regulating signs (the "Sign Ordinance") does not address rear wall signs; however, upon application to the ZBA, Section 6-103 of the Sign Ordinance, provides that "the zoning board of appeals may vary or otherwise modify the application of any section of this article to any particular case when, in the opinion of such board, the literal enforcement thereof would do manifest injustice or would be contrary to the spirit and purpose of this article or the public interest"; and
- 4. In accordance with the Illinois Compiled Statutes and the Sign Ordinance, notice of a public hearing regarding the requested Zoning Relief (the "Hearing") was published in one or more newspapers published in the Town; and
- 5. At the Hearing, the Applicant presented credible evidence demonstrating that: (a) the Applicant's rear of the building faces Cicero Avenue, a major thoroughfare through the Town, and the purpose is to increase visibility of the Existing Use; (b) plans and drawings indicate that the Applicant seeks to install a second illuminated business identification wall sign on the East (Cicero Avenue) building elevation; and (c) the proposed sign will be beneficial by increasing visibility to potential customers and clients traveling along Cicero Avenue, which has a high volume of traffic; and (d) the Applicant will comply with all requirements of the Town's Code of Ordinances (the "Town Code") related to the erection and illumination of the Signs; and
- 6. At the Hearing, the Applicant agrees that the sign would not exceed the square footage allowed for wall signs pursuant to the Sign Ordinance, not more than ten percent (10%) of the wall; and

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7. In light of the above, the ZBA found that granting the Zoning Relief would not: (a) endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort, or general welfare of the neighborhood; (b) harm the use or enjoyment of property in the immediate vicinity or damage neighboring property values; (c) impede upon the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding property; or (d) alter the essential character of the area. The ZBA further found that literal enforcement thereof would do manifest injustice or would be contrary to the spirit and purpose of this article or the public interest and as such, Zoning Relief should be granted.

#### **CONCLUSION; CONDITIONS**

The Applicant provided evidence that the requested Zoning Relief would comply with the requirements set forth in the Sign Ordinance. The Existing Use will not alter the essential character of the area nor negatively impact neighboring property values. Based on the foregoing, the ZBA recommends granting the Zoning Relief on the condition that the Applicant will substantially comply with the plans and exhibits presented to the ZBA, that the Applicant shall comply with the requirement of the Town Code, and that any variation from the plan or exhibits presented must be approved by Town staff.





RESOLUTION NO.	
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A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CERTAIN BINDING REFERENDUM QUESTION REGARDING WHETHER THE PROCESS FOR WRITE-IN CANDIDACIES FOR CERTAIN TOWN OF CICERO ELECTED OFFICES FOR THE PRIMARY AND THE GENERAL ELECTIONS IN THE TOWN OF CICERO, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS SHALL BE CREATED TO BE PLACED ON THE BALLOT TO BE VOTED ON AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2022, FOR THE TOWN OF CICERO, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cicero (the "Town") was created by a charter enacted by the Illinois General Assembly (the "Charter"); and

**WHEREAS,** the Corporate Authorities of the Town (as defined below) are governed by the Charter and the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the statutes of the State of Illinois when not specified in the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and as a home rule unit of local government the Town may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 6(f) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution further provides that a home rule municipality shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection and terms of office only as approved by referendum or as otherwise authorized by law; and

**WHEREAS,** in November, 2004, the citizens of the Town of Cicero (the "Town") voted to change the system of elections from a partisan system to a non-partisan system, as well as other changes to the manner in which the Town elects its officials; and

**WHEREAS**, the November, 2004 referendum was the result of Resolution 8-24, which created the unique system of non-partisan elections in the Town; and

**WHEREAS,** on February 9, 2021, the Cook County Circuit Court Judge Maureen O. Hannon found that the referendum passed in November, 2004, did not provide a system under which people could run as write-in candidates; and

WHEREAS, the Town President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees (the "Board") (collectively, the "Corporate Authorities") find that it is in the best interest of the Town and its residents to supplement the existing system of elections as outlined in Resolution 8-24 to allow write-in candidacies for persons who seek elected Town offices subject to certain conditions and specifications; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities hereby further find that it is in the best interest of the Town and its residents to vote upon a referendum to create a write-in candidacy procedure, and that said referendum shall be binding upon the Town, its residents, the local election authority, the election authority, and all other relevant parties; and

**NOW, THEREFORE,** be it resolved by the President and Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero, Cook County, Illinois in the exercise of Cicero's home rule powers as follows:

#### **SECTION 1:** Provisions of Constitution and the Municipal Code.

Pursuant to the 1970 Illinois Constitution, Article VII, Section 6(f), the following binding question shall appear on the November 8, 2022 General Election ballot:

SHALL BALLOTS CAST FOR WRITE-IN CANDIDATES FOR PRESIDENT, CLERK, SUPERVISOR, ASSESSOR, COLLECTOR, AND TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF CICERO BE COUNTED AT THE TOWN'S NONPARTISAN PRIMARY ELECTIONS SUBJECT TO THE SPECIFICATIONS DETAILED HEREIN?

#### **SECTION 2: Specifications to be Included on the Ballot After the Proposition.**

The following specifications shall be printed on the ballot along with the above proposition, and that these specifications govern the appropriate authorities, officers, and

persons should the proposition be approved by a majority of the electors in the Town voting on the question:

Votes for write-in candidates seeking election to the offices of President, Clerk, Supervisor, Assessor, Collector, and Trustees shall only be counted if the following conditions are met:

- A. The potential write-in candidate must file nomination papers as detailed below requesting that any write-in votes cast for said write-in candidate be counted for the election at which they seek election. By virtue of the Town of Cicero's unique system of elections, write-in candidacies shall only be allowed at primary elections.
- B. All write-in candidates for Town of Cicero elected offices must submit a write-in candidacy request subject to the requirements here-in. The form of the write-in candidacy request shall be as follows:

### WRITE-IN CANDIDACY REQUEST FOR TOWN OF CICERO ELECTED OFFICE

- C. The write-in candidacy request shall be signed in the aggregate by not less than 5%, nor more than 8% (or 50 more than the minimum, whichever is greater) of the number of ballots cast at the last preceding regular election in the Town of Cicero where Town of Cicero officers were elected, however, all said requests must contain a minimum of fifty (50) signatures signed by qualified electors of the Town of Cicero.
- D. The signers of the write-in candidacy request must state their name and address, including the identity of the municipality, the county, and the state in which the signer resides. The signature of the signer must be in the signer's own proper person. No one else can sign a write-in candidacy request on behalf of another, including but not limited to, a spouse signing for the other spouse and a parent signing for a child or vice versa.
- E. At the bottom of each sheet of such write-in candidacy request shall be added a circulator statement, commonly referred to as the "circulator's

affidavit", signed by a person 18 years of age or older who is a citizen of the United States, stating that person's street address or rural route number, as the case may be, as well as the county, city, village or town, and state; and certifying that the signatures on that sheet of the write-in candidacy request were signed in his or her presence and certifying that the signatures are genuine; and either (1) indicating the dates on which that sheet was circulated, or (2) indicating the first and last dates on which the sheet was circulated, or (3) certifying that none of the signatures on the sheet were signed more than 70 days preceding the last day for the filing of the write-in candidacy request and certifying that to the best of his or her knowledge and belief the persons so signing were at the time of signing the write-in candidacy request qualified voters of the Town of Cicero. Such statement shall be sworn to before some officer authorized to administer oaths in this State. In substantial part, the circulator's oath shall be as follows:

I, ...., do hereby certify that I reside at No. .... street, in the .... of ...., county of ...., and State of ....., that I am 18 years of age or older, that I am a citizen of the United States, and that the signatures on this sheet were signed in my presence, and are genuine, and that to the best of my knowledge and belief the persons so signing were at the time of signing the write-in candidacy request qualified voters of the Town of Cicero, County of Cook, State of Illinois, and that their respective residences are correctly stated, as above set forth.

Subscribed and sworn to before me on (insert date).

- F. There may only be one person circulating each individual write-in candidacy request. Co-circulation is strictly prohibited.
- G. The write-in candidacy request must identify the name and address of the proposed write-in candidate and shall state that the proposed write-in candidate is a qualified elector of the Town of Cicero, and possesses the proper qualifications, where required by law.
- H. Each write-in candidacy request shall only have one (1) candidate and any such requests submitted with multiple candidates must be rejected.
- I. Each sheet of the write-in candidacy request other than the statement of candidacy and candidate's statement shall be of uniform size and shall contain above the space for signatures an appropriate heading giving the information as to name of candidate, in whose behalf such write-in candidacy request is signed; the office and place of residence, as

- detailed above; and the heading of each sheet shall be the same.
- J. All signers of the write-in candidacy request must sign in their own proper person.
- K. No write-in candidacy request sheet shall be circulated more than 70 days preceding the last day provided in Section L herein.
- L. Write-in candidacy requests of potential write-in candidates shall be filed with the Town Clerk not more than 91 days and not less than 85 days prior to the date of the primary. The Town Clerk's office shall not accept any filings made after 5 p.m. on the last day of filing, unless the person making the filing was in line to file before 5 p.m. on the last day of filing.
- M. Signatures may be stricken from the write-in candidacy request sheets in the manner provided in Section 7-10 of the Illinois Election Code (10 ILCS 5/7-10).
- N. Write-in candidacy request sheets shall be securely and neatly fastened together, in book form, by placing the sheets in a pile and fastening them together at one edge in a secure and suitable manner, and the sheets shall be then numbered consecutively. The sheets shall not be fastened by pasting them together end to end, so as to form a continuous strip or roll.
- O. The write-in candidacy request sheets filed with the Town Clerk must be the original write-in candidacy request bearing the original signatures of the signers and the circulators.
- P. Each write-in candidacy request must include as a part thereof, a statement of candidacy for each of the candidates filing, or in whose behalf the write-in candidacy request is filed.
- Q. The statement of candidacy shall state (1) the address of such candidate, (2) the office for which he or she is a candidate, (3) that the candidate is a qualified elector and is qualified for the office specified, (4) that he or she has filed (or will file before the close of the write-in candidacy request filing period) a statement of economic interests as required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act, and (5) that the candidate requests that any write-in ballots cast for him or her be counted. The statement of candidacy shall be subscribed and sworn to by such candidate before some officer authorized to take acknowledgment of deeds in the State.
- R. For any office that requires a special certification, license, diplomas, or other qualification, the write-in candidate must include with and attach

- to the write-in candidacy request proof of said certification, license, or qualification.
- S. Write-in candidacy requests are not valid if the candidate named therein fails to file a statement of economic interests as required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act in relation to their candidacy with the Cook County Clerk by the end of the period for the filing of nomination papers unless they have filed a statement of economic interests in relation to the Town of Cicero with the Cook County Clerk during the same calendar year as the year in which such write-in candidacy request papers were filed. The write-in candidate must file with and securely attach to their write-in candidacy request papers a receipt from the Cook County Clerk showing the date on which such statement was filed.
- T. In addition to filing a write-in candidacy request with the Town Clerk, the requesting write-in candidate must also file a notarized declaration of intent to be a write in candidate with the Cook County Clerk's office no later than 85days before the election and it shall be on the form provided by the Cook County Clerk's office and a copy of this form shall also be filed with the Town Clerk. If objections are made and sustain against the write-in candidate's request, the candidate shall not be allowed to run as a write-in candidate for Town of Cicero elected offices.
- U. Any challenges or objections to an individual's write-in candidacy request shall be made in accordance with Section 10-8 through 10-10.1 of the Illinois Election Code (10 ILCS 10-8 through 10 ILCS 10-10.1). Said challenges or objections shall be filed with the Town Clerk and a copy shall also be sent to the Cook County Clerk, Elections Division.

#### **SECTION 3:** Enabling Provision.

If a majority of the voters in the municipality vote affirmatively on the question, then all write-in candidates shall present petition papers, which comply with the specifications stated in Section Two hereinbefore provided, to the Town Clerk in order to have any votes counted for the Town office he or she is seeking.

#### **SECTION 4:** Town Clerk.

The Town Clerk shall file this Resolution in her office and certify the question and specifications to the Cook County Clerk for placement on the November 8, 2022, general

election ballot, as included in Exhibit A attached hereto.

#### **SECTION 5. Publication of Notice.**

Notice of said Election (the "Notice") and the referendum shall be given in accordance with Article 12 of the Election Code by the election authority. (10 ILCS 5/12-1, et seq.)

#### **SECTION 6. Posting Notice.**

The Town Clerk shall also post a copy of the Notice at the principal office of the Town prior to the date of the Election in a timely manner in accordance with Section 12-5 of the Election Code. (10 ILCS 5/12-5)

#### **SECTION 7. Specimen Ballot.**

When an electronic voting system is used at the Election, the election authority shall cause a true and legible copy of the specimen ballot label to be used at the Election to be published and made available for public distribution, and to be supplied to the judges of said Election for posting in the polling places on the day of the Election, as required by Section 24A-18 of the Election Code (10 ILCS 5/24A-18).

#### **SECTION 8.** Newspaper Publication.

The Town President and Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero find and determine that the Lawndale News and El Dia are local community newspapers having general circulation in the Town, as required by Section 12-5 of the Election Code (10 ILCS 5/12-5).

#### **SECTION 9. Conduct of Election.**

Said Election shall be held and conducted and the returns thereof duly canvassed, all in the manner and the time provided by state law. The advisory proposition hereinafter set forth be submitted to the voters of the Town at the General Election to be held on Tuesday, the 8th day of November, 2022, between the hours of 6:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 o'clock P.M. on said

day (the "Election"), unless the hours of election are otherwise extended by court order or by order of the applicable election authority. That the Election shall be held in the voting precincts and at the polling places established by the Cook County Clerk (the "County Clerk") for voters of the Town at the Election.

#### **SECTION 10. Publication of Notice**

The Notice published by the County Clerk, in a community newspaper having general circulation in the Town, shall be in substantially the following form:

"NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the General Election to be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, the following advisory proposition shall be submitted to the voters of the Town of Cicero, Cook County, Illinois:

SHALL BALLOTS CAST FOR WRITE-IN CANDIDATES FOR PRESIDENT, CLERK, SUPERVISOR, ASSESSOR, COLLECTOR, AND TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF CICERO BE COUNTED AT THE TOWN'S NONPARTISAN PRIMARY ELECTIONS SUBJECT TO THE SPECIFICATIONS DETAILED HEREIN?

Votes for write-in candidates seeking election to the offices of President, Clerk, Supervisor, Assessor, Collector, and Trustees shall only be counted if the following conditions are met:

- A. The potential write-in candidate must file nomination papers as detailed below requesting that any write-in votes cast for said write-in candidate be counted for the election to at which they seek election. By virtue of the Town of Cicero's unique system of elections, write-in candidacies shall only be allowed at primary elections.
- B. All write-in candidates for Town of Cicero elected offices must submit a write-in candidacy request subject to the requirements here-in. The form of the write-in candidacy request shall be as follows:

### WRITE-IN CANDIDACY REQUEST FOR TOWN OF CICERO ELECTED OFFICE

We, the undersigned, qualified electors of the Town of Cicero, in the County of Cook, State of Illinois, do hereby request that the following named person shall be a write-in candidate for the office of , to be voted for at the \_\_\_\_\_(primary election) election to be held on (insert date).

- C. The write-in candidacy request shall be signed in the aggregate by not less than 5%, nor more than 8% (or 50 more than the minimum, whichever is greater) of the number of ballots cast at the last preceding regular election in the Town of Cicero where Town of Cicero officers were elected, however, all said requests must contain a minimum of fifty (50) signatures signed by qualified electors of the Town of Cicero.
- D. The signers of the write-in candidacy request must state their name and address, including the identity of the municipality, the county and the state in which the signer resides. The signature of the signer must be in the signer's own proper person. No one else can sign a write-in candidacy request on behalf of another, including but not limited to a spouse signing

for the other spouse and a parent signing for a child or vice versa.

E. At the bottom of each sheet of such write-in candidacy request shall be added a circulator statement, commonly referred to as the "circulator's affidavit", signed by a person 18 years of age or older who is a citizen of the United States, stating that person's street address or rural route number, as the case may be, as well as the county, city, village or town, and state; and certifying that the signatures on that sheet of the write-in candidacy request were signed in his or her presence and certifying that the signatures are genuine; and either (1) indicating the dates on which that sheet was circulated, or (2) indicating the first and last dates on which the sheet was circulated, or (3) certifying that none of the signatures on the sheet were signed more than 70 days preceding the last day for the filing of the writein candidacy request and certifying that to the best of his or her knowledge and belief the persons so signing were at the time of signing the write-in candidacy request qualified voters of the Town of Cicero. Such statement shall be sworn to before some officer authorized to administer oaths in this State. In substantial part, the circulator's oath shall be as follows:

I, ...., do hereby certify that I reside at No. .... street, in the .... of ...., county of ...., and State of ....., that I am 18 years of age or older, that I am a citizen of the United States, and that the signatures on this sheet were signed in my presence, and are genuine, and that to the best of my knowledge and belief the persons so signing were at the time of signing the write-in candidacy request qualified voters of the Town of Cicero, County of Cook, State of Illinois, and that their respective residences are correctly stated, as above set forth.

- F. There may only be one person circulating each individual write-in candidacy request. Co-circulation is strictly prohibited.
- G. The write-in candidacy request must identify the name and address of the proposed write-in candidate and shall state that the proposed write-in candidate is a qualified elector of the Town of Cicero, and possesses the proper qualifications, where required by law.
- H. Each write-in candidacy request shall only have one (1) candidate and any such requests submitted with multiple candidates must be rejected.
- I. Each sheet of the write-in candidacy request other than the statement of candidacy and candidate's statement shall be of uniform size and shall

contain above the space for signatures an appropriate heading giving the information as to name of candidate, in whose behalf such write-in candidacy request is signed; the office and place of residence, as detailed above; and the heading of each sheet shall be the same.

- J. All signers of the write-in candidacy request must sign in their own proper person.
- K. No write-in candidacy request sheet shall be circulated more than 70 days preceding the last day provided in Section L herein.
- L. Write-in candidacy requests of potential write-in candidates shall be filed with the Town Clerk not more than 91 days and not less than 85 days prior to the date of the primary. The Town Clerk's office shall not accept any filings made after 5 p.m. on the last day of filing, unless the person making the filing was in line to file before 5 p.m. on the last day of filing.
- M. Signatures may be stricken from the write-in candidacy request sheets in the manner provided in Section 7-10 of the Illinois Election Code (10 ILCS 5/7-10).
- N. Write-in candidacy request sheets shall be securely and neatly fastened together, in book form, by placing the sheets in a pile and fastening them together at one edge in a secure and suitable manner, and the sheets shall be then numbered consecutively. The sheets shall not be fastened by pasting them together end to end, so as to form a continuous strip or roll.
- O. The write-in candidacy request sheets filed with the Town Clerk must be the original write-in candidacy request bearing the original signatures of the signers and the circulators.
- P. Each write-in candidacy request must include as a part thereof, a statement of candidacy for each of the candidates filing, or in whose behalf the write-in candidacy request is filed.
- Q. The statement of candidacy shall state (1) the address of such candidate, (2) the office for which he or she is a candidate, (3) that the candidate is a qualified elector and is qualified for the office specified, (4) that he or she has filed (or will file before the close of the write-in candidacy request filing period) a statement of economic interests as required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act, and (5) that the candidate requests that any write-in ballots cast for him or her be counted. The statement of candidacy shall be subscribed and sworn to by such candidate before some officer authorized to take acknowledgment of deeds in the State.

- R. For any office that requires a special certification, license, diplomas, or other qualification, the write-in candidate must include with and attach to the write-in candidacy request proof of said certification, license, or qualification.
- S. Write-in candidacy requests are not valid if the candidate named therein fails to file a statement of economic interests as required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act in relation to their candidacy with the Cook County Clerk by the end of the period for the filing of nomination papers unless they have filed a statement of economic interests in relation to the Town of Cicero with the Cook County Clerk during the same calendar year as the year in which such write-in candidacy request papers were filed. The write-in candidate must file with and securely attach to their write-in candidacy request papers a receipt from the Cook County Clerk showing the date on which such statement was filed.
- T. In addition to filing a write-in candidacy request with the Town Clerk, the requesting write-in candidate must also file a notarized declaration of intent to be a write in candidate with the Cook County Clerk's office no later than 85days before the election and it shall be on the form provided by the Cook County Clerk's office and a copy of this form shall also be filed with the Town Clerk. If objections are made and sustain against the write-in candidate's request, the candidate shall not be allowed to run as a write-in candidate for Town of Cicero elected offices.
- U. #### RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CERTAIN ADVISORY REFERENDUM QUESTION REGARDING WHETHER THE COOK COUNTY STATE'S ATTORNEY SHOULD BE REQUIRED TO PRESS AND PROSECUTE CHARGES WHERE FIREARMS ARE USED OR DISCHARGED DURING THE COMMISSION OF AN ALLEGED CRIME, INCLUDING FELONIES AND MISDEMEANORS, TO BE PLACED ON THE BALLOT TO BE VOTED ON AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2022 FOR THE TOWN OF CICERO, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cicero (the "Town") was created by a charter enacted by the Illinois General Assembly (the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Town (as defined below) are governed by the Charter and the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the statutes of the State of Illinois when not specified in the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and as a home rule unit of local government the Town may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Section 3.1-40-60 of the Illinois Municipal Code (the "Municipal Code") (65 ILCS 5/3.1-40-60) authorizes the Board of Trustees (the "Town Board") to place an advisory question of public policy on the ballot at the next regularly scheduled election; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Medical Examiner's Office ("CCMEO") confirmed 1,002 gun-related homicides in 2021, breaking the previous record of 881 set in 2020; and WHEREAS, gun related crimes and violence have increased in the Cook County

area and Town citizens have expressed concerns related to the lack of prosecution of

alleged crimes, including felonies and misdemeanors, where firearms are used or discharged during the commission of the alleged crime, including felonies and misdemeanors; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County State's Attorney has, in the past, delayed or not brought charges for such alleged gun related crimes, including felonies and misdemeanors; and

WHEREAS, the Town President (the "President") and the Town Board (collectively, the "Corporate Authorities") desire to poll residents regarding whether the Cook County State's Attorney should be required to press and prosecute charges where firearms are used or discharged during the commission of an alleged crime, including felonies and misdemeanors; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities deem it advisable, necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Town, and in the best interests of the Town to authorize an advisory referendum regarding whether the Cook County State's Attorney should be required to press and prosecute charges where firearms are used or discharged during the commission of an alleged crime, including felonies and misdemeanors, to be placed on the ballot to be voted on at the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and the duly authorized Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

### ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

#### Section 1.0 Findings.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Resolution as legislative findings.

#### Section 2.0 Purpose.

The purpose of this Resolution is to authorize an advisory referendum to be placed on the ballot to be voted on at the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022, and to authorize the Town to take any and all necessary steps to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

#### **Section 3.0 Invocation of Authority.**

This Resolution is adopted pursuant to the authority granted to the Town by the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Illinois Compiled Statutes.

#### Section 4.0 State Law Adopted.

All applicable provisions of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, including the Illinois Municipal Code, as may be amended from time to time, relating to the purposes of this Resolution are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

### ARTICLE II. QUESTION AND AUTHORIZATION

#### Section 5.0 Question.

That the question, as set forth in Section 5.1 of this Resolution, shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the Town in accordance with the applicable provisions of the

Illinois Election Code (the "Election Code") at the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022.

#### Section 5.1 Authorization.

The Corporate Authorities hereby authorize a certain advisory referendum to be placed on the ballot to be voted on at the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022. That the referendum to be voted on at the General Election shall be in substantially the following form, as required by Section 16-7 of the Election Code (10 ILCS 5/16-7), with such alterations, changes, insertions, and deletions as are required by Article 24A of the Election Code if an electronic, mechanical, or electric voting system is used at the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022:

Shall the Cook County State's Attorney be required to press and prosecute charges where firearms are used or discharged during the commission of an alleged crime,	YES
including felonies and misdemeanors?	NO

Section 5.2 Authorization and Direction to Town Officers.

That the Town Board hereby authorizes and directs the President or his designee to execute this Resolution. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign this Resolution and any such other documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Resolution. The Town Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Town to such documentation as is deemed necessary. The Town Clerk is further authorized and directed to certify the advisory referendum to the

election authority of Cook County, Illinois, in accordance with Section 28-5 of the Election Code (10 ILCS 5/28-5).

#### Section 5.3 Other Actions Authorized.

The officers, employees, and/or agents of the Town shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to, and consummate the transactions contemplated by this Resolution and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees, and/or agents of the Town are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or documents to be utilized in connection with the aforementioned referendum.

**Section 5.4** That the advisory proposition hereinafter set forth be submitted to the voters of the Town at the General Election to be held on Tuesday, the 8<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2022, between the hours of 6:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 o'clock P.M. on said day (the "Election"), unless the hours of election are otherwise extended by court order or by order of the applicable election authority.

**Section 5.5** That the Election shall be held in the voting precincts and at the polling places established by the Cook County Clerk (the "County Clerk") for voters of the Town at the Election.

Section 5.6 That the County Clerk shall give notice of the Election (the "Notice") by: (i) publishing the Notice once, not more than sixty (60) nor less than ten (10) days prior to the date of the Election, in a local, community newspaper having general circulation in the Town; and (ii) posting a copy of the Notice at least ten (10) days before the date of the Election at their respective principal offices, as required by Section 12-5 of the Election Code (10 ILCS 5/12-5).

**Section 5.7** That the Town Clerk shall post a copy of the Notice at least ten (10) days before the date of the Election.

**Section 5.8** That the Notice published by the County Clerk, in a community newspaper having general circulation in the Town, shall be in substantially the following form:

"NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the General Election to be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, the following advisory proposition shall be submitted to the voters of the Town of Cicero, Cook County, Illinois:

Shall the Cook County State's Attorney be required to press and prosecute charges where firearms are used or discharged during the commission of an alleged crime, including felonies and misdemeanors?

The polls at said election will be open at 6:00 o'clock A.M. and will continue to be open until 7:00 o'clock P.M. of that day, unless the hours of election are otherwise extended by court order or by order of the applicable election authority.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules, and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

#### Section 9.0 Publication.

A full, true, and complete copy of this Resolution shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Town as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

#### Section 10.0 Effective Date.

This Resolution shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CERTAIN ADVISORY REFERENDUM QUESTION REGARDING HOURS OF LIQUOR CONSUMPTION, SALES, SERVICE, AND GIVE-AWAYS AT CERTAIN PREMISES LICENSED BY THE TOWN OF CICERO TO BE PLACED ON THE BALLOT TO BE VOTED ON AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2022, FOR THE TOWN OF CICERO, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

**WHEREAS,** the Town of Cicero (the "Town") was created by a charter enacted by the Illinois General Assembly (the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Town (as defined below) are governed by the Charter and the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the statutes of the State of Illinois when not specified in the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and as a home rule unit of local government the Town may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Section 3.1-40-60 of the Illinois Municipal Code (the "Municipal Code") (65 ILCS 5/3.1-40-60) authorizes the Board of Trustees (the "Town Board") to place an advisory question of public policy on the ballot at the next regularly scheduled election; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-102 of the Town Code of Ordinances (the "Town Code") currently provides no alcoholic liquor shall be sold, given away, offered for sale, served, or dispensed on or about any premises or place of business where alcoholic liquor is sold, handled, or kept for sale between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. on Mondays through Saturdays of each week, and the premises must be free

of all patrons no later than 2:15 a.m.; and that no alcoholic liquor shall be sold, given away, offered for sale, served, or dispensed in, or upon or about any premises or place of business where alcoholic liquor is sold, handled, or kept for sale between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., on Sunday of each week, and the premises must be free of all patrons by 3:15 a.m. on Sunday of each week; and

WHEREAS, many members of the public have expressed concerns regarding the hours of alcohol consumption, sales, service, and give-aways at some bars, restaurants, banquet halls, entertainment venues, liquor stores, and other similar establishments and venues due to, in some cases, said hours of operation leading directly or indirectly to increased intoxication of patrons and in some cases, incidents of violence, property destruction, and driving under the influence of alcohol; and

WHEREAS, many license holders operate in residential areas or mixed use (commercial and residential areas) and the residents of those areas have made numerous complaints regarding excessive noise, a lack of parking, destruction or damage to their property, damage or destruction to municipal property, and acts of violence against persons or property; and

WHEREAS, however, the Corporate Authorities have found that generally, businesses where the gross receipts for the sale of alcoholic liquor account for less than fifty percent (50%) of the total gross receipts, such as gas stations, convenience stores, grocery stores, and similar businesses, have not generated as many citizen complaints; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that the decision regarding the hours of operation of certain liquor establishments, excluding those

where the gross receipts for the sale of alcoholic liquor account for less than fifty percent (50%) of the total gross receipts, in the Town should be decided by the electors of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Town and its residents and guests to place an advisory referendum question on the ballot for the November 8, 2022, General Election (the "Election") asking whether the Town electors want to reduce the hours of operation so that no alcoholic liquor shall be sold, given away, offered for sale, served, or dispensed on or about any premises or place of business where alcoholic liquor is sold, handled, or kept for sale, except for those businesses where the gross receipts for the sale of alcoholic liquor account for less than fifty percent (50%) of the total gross receipts, between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. on Mondays through Fridays of each week, between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. on Saturdays and 11:00 a.m., on Sunday of each week, and the premises must be free of all patrons no later than fifteen (15) minutes after closing time; and

**NOW, THEREFORE,** be it resolved by the President and Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero, Cook County, Illinois in the exercise of the Town's home rule powers as follows:

# ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

#### Section 1.0 Findings.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Resolution as legislative findings.

#### Section 2.0 Purpose.

The purpose of this Resolution is to authorize an advisory referendum to be placed on the ballot to be voted on at the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022, and to authorize the Town to take any and all necessary steps to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

#### **Section 3.0 Invocation of Authority.**

This Resolution is adopted pursuant to the authority granted to the Town by the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Illinois Compiled Statutes.

#### Section 4.0 State Law Adopted.

All applicable provisions of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, including the Illinois Municipal Code, as may be amended from time to time, relating to the purposes of this Resolution are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

# ARTICLE II. QUESTION AND AUTHORIZATION

#### Section 5.0 Question.

That the question, as set forth in Section 5.1 of this Resolution, shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the Town in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Illinois Election Code (the "Election Code") at the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022.

#### **Section 5.1** Authorization.

The Corporate Authorities hereby authorize a certain advisory referendum to be placed on the ballot to be voted on at the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022. That the referendum to be voted on at the General Election shall be in substantially the

following form, as required by Section 16-7 of the Election Code (10 ILCS 5/16-7), with such alterations, changes, insertions, and deletions as are required by Article 24A of the Election Code if an electronic, mechanical, or electric voting system is used at the General Election to be held on November 8, 2022:

Section 5.2 Authorization and Direction to Town Officers.

The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign this Resolution and any such other documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Resolution. The Town Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Town to such documentation as is deemed necessary. The Town Clerk is further authorized and directed to certify the advisory referendum to the election authority of Cook County, Illinois, in accordance with Section 28-5 of the Election Code (10 ILCS 5/28-5).

#### Section 5.3 Other Actions Authorized.

The officers, employees, and/or agents of the Town shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to, and consummate the transactions contemplated by this Resolution and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. The officers, employees, and/or agents of the Town are specifically authorized and directed to draft and disseminate any and all necessary forms or documents to be utilized in connection with the aforementioned referendum.

**Section 5.4** That the advisory proposition hereinafter set forth be submitted to the voters of the Town at the General Election to be held on Tuesday, the 8<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2022, between the hours of 6:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 o'clock P.M. on said day (the "Election"), unless the hours of election are otherwise extended by court order or by order of the applicable election authority.

**Section 5.5** That the Election shall be held in the voting precincts and at the polling places established by the Cook County Clerk (the "County Clerk") for voters of the Town at the Election.

**Section 5.6** That the County Clerk shall give notice of the public question (the "Notice") by: (i) publishing the Notice once, not more than sixty (60) nor less than ten (10) days prior to the date of the Election, in a local, community newspaper having general circulation in the Town; and (ii) posting a copy of the Notice at least ten (10) days before the date of the Election at their respective principal offices, as required by Section 12-5 of the Election Code (10 ILCS 5/12-5).

**Section 5.7** That the Town Clerk shall post a copy of the Notice at least ten (10) days before the date of the Election.

**Section 5.8** That the Notice published by the County Clerk, in a community newspaper having general circulation in the Town, shall be in substantially the following form:

"NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the General Election to be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, the following advisory proposition shall be submitted to the voters of the Town of Cicero, Cook County, Illinois:

Shall the closing hours of businesses holding a liquor license be moved up one hour where the new closing time shall be 1:00 a.m. on Mondays (Sunday night into Monday morning) through Fridays (Thursday night into Friday morning) and 2:00 a.m. on Saturdays (Friday night into Saturday morning) and Sundays (Saturday night into Sunday morning), with all patrons needing to leave the premises no more than fifteen (15) minutes after closing, except that these new sale hours will not apply to businesses where the gross receipts for the sale of alcoholic liquor account for less than fifty percent (50%) of the total gross receipts or where the specific license classification dictates hours of operation different than those stated in this question?

The polls at said election will be open at 6:00 o'clock A.M. and will continue to be open until 7:00 o'clock P.M. of that day, unless the hours of election are otherwise extended by court order or by order of the applicable election authority.

A RESOLUTION RATIFYING AN INVOICE FROM KLANDESTINO ENTERTAINMENT INC. AND AUTHORIZING THE TOWN PRESIDENT TO ENTER INTO CERTAIN AGREEMENTS WITH KLANDESTINO ENTERTAINMENT INC. TO PROVIDE SERVICES TO THE TOWN OF CICERO, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Town of Cicero (the "Town") was created by a charter enacted by the Illinois General Assembly (the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Town (as defined below) are governed by the Charter and the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the statutes of the State of Illinois when not specified in the Charter; and

Cinco De Mayo Festival, the Mexican Independence Day Festival, the Houby Days Festival, and the Cicero Fest (collectively, the "Festivals"); and

WHEREAS, the Town recognizes the need for a third party to provide artists and live entertainment for the Festivals, including an additional stage for performing artists (the "Services"); and

WHEREAS, Klandestino Entertainment Inc. ("Klandestino") has provided the Corporate Authorities with certain agreements (the "Agreements"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Group Exhibit A, which set forth the terms, covenants, and conditions under which Klandestino will provide the Services to the Town; and

WHEREAS, Klandestino provided the Services for the Cinco De Mayo Festival in May, 2022, and a copy of the invoice for the same is included in Group Exhibit A (the "Invoice"); and



SUBJECT: Insurance: Workers' Comp, Vacant Properties, and Special Events Insurance

In connection with the renewal of the above insurance policies, the Town's insurance brokers have asked us to provide the following information:

#### WORKERS' COMPENSATION

After many years with Safety National being the only Workers' Comp Insurer willing to offer Cicero a reasonable quote, this year Cicero has the option for coverage with ICRMT, the Town's property and liability insurance carrier.

The Safety National quote is essentially the same as last year, \$255,733, with a service fee of \$25,000, for a total of \$280,733.

The ICRMT quote is \$252,690, which is the total cost with no service fee and no additional payment to the TPA, IPMG. The ICRMT policy requires all insureds to use IPMG as their TPA. ICRMT incorporates the expense of the TPA services into its premium. The result being that Cicero receives the TPA services at no extra cost.

#### VACANT PROPERTIES

The Town's vacant buildings, property damage, insurance is up for renewal. The liability insurance for vacant properties is now covered by the Town's ICRMT policy. There is a \$6,000 decrease in the premium for the property damage insurance, which will be \$29,591, for next year. Details are provided in the attached Alliant/Mesirow Proposal.

#### **SPECIAL EVENTS**

The Special Events program consists of two policies, liability, and dram shop/liquor liability. The general liability policy with Lloyd's of London has a premium increase to \$90,128 due increased attendance at events. Lloyd's no longer offers dram shop insurance. The dram shop insurance is now with National Specialty Insurance Company with a premium of \$6,375.

The above matters were reviewed by the Insurance Committee on June 21.

#### **Executive Summary**

The Public Entity of Alliant Insurance Services appreciate the opportunity to present the following Excess Workers Compensation, Vacant Property, and Crime proposal to Town of Cicero for the upcoming July 1, 2022 – 2023 insurance renewal.

#### **Current Marketplace**

Insurance rates are continuing to increase across the board within the marketplace. Even prior to COVID-19, the insurance marketplace had hardened significantly with overall renewal increases averaging between 10%-25%. As the pandemic continues, we continue to see rate increases as we enter Q3 of 2022.

#### **Excess Workers Compensation**

Alliant secured two program options for Town of Cicero's consideration.

Safety National Insurance Company provided a renewal quote that despite market conditions, was a flat rate. The recognition of the long-time history with the Town of Cicero and last year's increase of the Self-Insured Retention from \$750,000 - \$800,000 contributed to this favorable renewal. While the premium went up slightly, .35% or \$887, it was solely driven by the estimated increase in payrolls.

The second option is with Illinois Counties Risk Management Trust (ICRMT). ICRMT is your property and liability carrier and those coverages renew December 1, 2022. The ICRMT quoted premium is similar to Safety National's premium but with extraneous factors, ICRMT's quote becomes a cost savings to Cicero.

ICRMT requires all claims be handled by their Third-Party Administrator and thus the claims handling fees are incorporated into the premium. The TPA that handles the claims is IPMG which is the Town's current TPA. If the decision is made to bind coverage with ICRMT, Cicero may forego the contract and fees associated with the IPMG contract. However, Cicero will still benefit by having their current TPA and established adjusters will remain intact.

The other advantage is ICRMT pricing includes commission. The commission is paid to Alliant Insurance Services as your broker. Historically, we have been paid a fee for our services and that may now be eliminated if Cicero agrees that Alliant may accept commission. There is separate pricing if Cicero wishes Alliant to remain on the service fee.

#### **Vacant Property**

The coverage continues to be offered by with Berkshire Hathaway for the property for the vacant buildings. However, the terms of the coverage changed. Due to the length of the vacancy of the building, the carrier will only provide Actual Cash Value on the buildings. An additional term that was changed is the and the types of losses the carrier will cover. Two of the three buildings were insured on a Special form versus basic form. Now all three buildings will be covered for Basic losses. The definition of Special versus Basic is on page 9 of the proposal.

As Berkshire Hathaway reduced their coverage. Other markets were approached for possible quote at replacement cost basis and special form. The market did not have offer any options matching the expiring terms.

The rates for the property at an actual cash value and basic form to prompt a reduction in premium. The renewal premium for the vacant building property premium is **\$29,591 excluding TRIA.** This reflects a reduction of \$6,623.

The general liability for the vacant building's locations quantinue to be covered under the Package Liability carrier, Illinois Counties Risk Management Trust.


## **Cyber Liability**

The cyber security insurance markets continue to be challenged by Cybercrime losses. By way of example, cyber-crime is projected to hit \$6 trillion annually by 2021, was \$2 trillion in 2019. Ransomware is now the fastest growing in frequency and severity of claims for insurance companies.

Largest cyber extortion demand +\$20M Largest cyber extortion payment +\$5M

There is no foreseeable slowdown for ransomware claims. All industry segments were impacted. Manufacturing and professional services were particularly hard hit, followed closely by healthcare, education, and government entities.

The pie chart below illustrates the percentages of cyberattacks by public entity.



Specific to the Town of Cicero, the marketplace declined to quote the risk. Organization-wide, the Town of Cicero is lacking controls and safety-measures that would make it an acceptable risk for a Cyber Liability carrier. In addition to that fact, there was a Cyber claim in Cicero this past term that also prompted declinations from the market place. The market responses are listed on page 7 of the proposal.

Alliant Insurance Services continues to find options for cyber liability for the Town of Cicero but at this time, there is not a carrier willing to offer coverage at 7/1/2022.





WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Town (as defined below) are governed by the Charter and the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the statutes of the State of Illinois when not specified in the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home rule unit of local government as is provided by Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and as a home rule unit of local government the Town may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Town President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Town (the "Town Board", and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to the efficient operation of government; and

WHEREAS, All Mechanical Industries, Inc. D/B/A EHMS Mechanical Services ("EHMS") has provided the Town with a proposal (the "Proposal"), a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, whereby EHMS will provide emergency repair and/or replacement services for the compressor located in the Town's Council Chambers (the "Services"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Town to authorize and approve the Proposal for the Services and to waive bidding for said Services in light of the emergency nature of the repairs; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and the duly authorized Board of Trustees of the Town of Cicero, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

# ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

#### Section 1.0 Findings.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true, and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Resolution as legislative findings.

#### Section 2.0 Purpose.

The purpose of this Resolution is to authorize the President or his designee to authorize, enter into, and approve the Proposal for the Services and to further authorize the President, or his designee, to take all steps necessary to carry out the terms of the Proposal, and to ratify any steps taken to effectuate that goal.

# ARTICLE II. AUTHORIZATION

#### Section 3.0 Authorization.

That the Town Board hereby waives any applicable bidding requirements for the Services, and authorizes and directs the President, or his designee, to enter into and approve the Proposal in accordance with its terms, or any modification thereof, and to ratify any and all previous action taken to effectuate the intent of this Resolution. To the extent that any requirement of bidding would be applicable to the Services described herein, the same is hereby waived.
